

# Engage and Support the Progress of Boys

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Whilst the education gender gap continues to fluctuate each year, one consistency is female students continuing to outperform boys at primary and secondary level. 2017 GCSE results showed that 71 per cent of female entries were awarded at least a C or a 4 grade, compared with just 61.5 per cent of their male counterparts. However, what exam results don't show is how the gender gap and the underperformance of boys is bad for girls too.

### How do we close the education gender gap?

Well, strategies to engage boys in reading and writing along with designing effective catch-up plans and interventions are proven to drive attainment amongst boys, and we'll be covering each of these during the conference.

We will also be focusing on the insights schools require to ensure that the gender gap doesn't widen as a result of bias towards learning. Leading experts in this field will offer their insights on how to design a curriculum and foster a school culture which lends itself to the innate behaviours, maturity levels and learning styles of boys.
