



At her speech at the Schools North East Summit, Ofsted Chief Inspector Amanda Spielman announced that pupil personal development will be judged separately as part of school inspections from 2019 onwards.

'This change recognises the difference between behaviour and discipline in schools, and pupils' wider personal development and their opportunities to grow as active, healthy and engaged citizens.'

Ofsted has announced plans to remove judgements inspectors make on pupils' personal development, behaviour and welfare. Instead, schools will be examined on the behaviour and attitudes of students, along with the students' personal development.

There is a plethora of benefits that come from developing pupils into independent and healthy young adults. As the world continues to be increasingly ever-changing and unpredictable, embodying your students with principles of emotional literacy, growth mindsets and resilience will prepare them for the jobs that are yet to exist along with how to cope with failure.
