
## **GUIDANCE ON HOW TO CLOSE THIS GAP**

- 1 Identify students from disadvantaged backgrounds early, provide comprehensive and aspirational guidance and track their progress;
- **2 Start talking about all pathways earlier** from KS3, KS4 and throughout the curriculum;
- 3 Engage with your widening participation teams at local unis to deliver sessions to inspire students and highlight available support;
- 4 Provide more information to both students and parents/carers on bursaries, scholarships and contextual offers.

More likely to use "Top ranked universities" filter





Sixth form girls are more likely to want to **study abroad** as part of their degrees, whereas boys more interested in **prestige and higher salaries**.

The **STEM gender gap persists** in Sixth Form career favourites, with Computers and Mechanical Science appearing in boys' top 5 but not even girls' top 10. Highlighted careers in the table don't show in the top 10 list for the opposite gender.


 Enable all students to have access to information about the full spectrum of career destinations


 Delivering careers within the curriculum, especially within STEM subjects, and providing role models to underrepresented groups to inspire and motivate
