Why even have a procurement strategy?





High level considerations



What things should you be considering as you start the process of writing your strategy?

The needs of the Trust versus the needs of individual schools

Who are your key stakeholders in the procurement strategy?

Your own internal financial regulations and purchasing processes

What information you already have and what you need

Is any internal/external benchmarking required

The specific market for the goods and services

In-house or outsourced



Procurement and Contracts Officer

Pros and cons for both options and much will depend on the size of your Trust

How much is centralised and how much devolved

Don't underestimate the work involved – minimum of 55 hours to run an OJEU process for one school and one spend category

Usually takes between 3-6 months to run from start to finish

Development of legal contracts

Will that individual be in charge of post contract monitoring

Quick wins

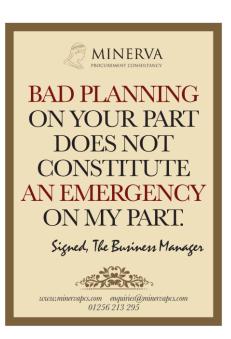
- Where can you score some quick wins to kick start the strategy?

 - Stationery



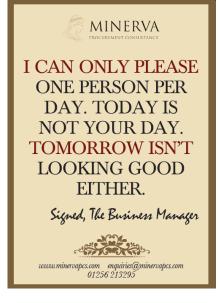

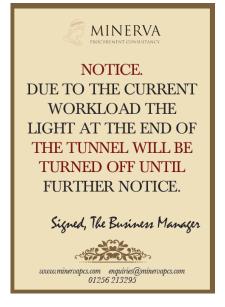
