Tackling Low-Level Disruption

Why should I do this course?

- This training course is designed to help staff promote positive behaviour, tackle incidents of poor behaviour and effectively minimise the impact of low-level disruption on learning. It will enable participants to:
 - Promote positive behaviours: learn strategies for teaching positive behaviours for learning and developing an effective classroom environment.
 - Deal with low-level disruption: how to tackle inappropriate behaviour whilst not disrupting the lesson flow
 - Manage their own behaviour: be aware of the impact of their behaviour on the behaviour of those around them, and modify their behaviour to suit.

Making the most of this course

- This course is comprised of two units, the first looking at promoting positive behaviour, and the second looking responding to low-level disruption.
- Both units last around 80-90 minutes, and can both be split into two 40-minute chunks if necessary.

Suggested participants

<u>1. Promoting Positive Behaviour for Learning</u>

Lead behaviour effectively and successfully teach positive behaviours for learning to improve pupil engagement in the classroom

This unit will enable participants to:

- Consider their own values and beliefs about pupil behaviour.
- Examine the effect of their own behaviour and how they can control it.
- Identify behaviours for learning that they can teach.
- Learn strategies for teaching these positive behaviours for learning to improve behaviour across the whole school.

2. Responding Effectively to Low-Level Disruption

- Maintain their own and their pupils' dignity
- Tackle inappropriate behaviour whilst protecting le •
